The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (DJJDP) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent, undisciplined and at-risk youth for the state fiscal year 2010-2011 beginning on, or after July 1, 2010. The use of JCPC funds in this county requires a local match in the amount specified above.

**The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed Programs:**

1) Parent/Family Skills 2) Restitution 3) Teen Court 4) Individual Counseling 5) Family Counseling 6) Psychological Testing 7) Home Based Family Services 8) Structured Day Programs 9) Interpersonal Skill Building

Proposed Program Services should target Risk Factors for Delinquency or Repeat Delinquency:

Youth who are currently involved with or have prior juvenile court referrals, have moderate to serious school behavior problems, have parents who need parent family skills classes (for 16 weeks of service), are in need of psychological and may be in need of individual counseling, family counseling or home based family services.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs assessment for Adjudicated Youth:

Peer Domain:

Youth who sometimes or regularly associate with delinquent peers, are gang involved or associate with gang members

Individual Domain:

Youth who are in need of mental health assessments and /or treatment

Family Domain:

Parents who have marginal or inadequate parenting skills, family members who have a current or past criminal history or who have known gang involvement.

School Domain:

Youth have moderate and serious school behavior problems

**Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below:**

1. Program services that are compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
5. Programs that have a demonstrated impact on the following success factors: a. reduce subsequent complaints; b. reduce violations of terms of community supervision; c. reduce convictions for subsequent offenses; d. fulfill restitution to victims; and, e. increase parental accountability.

Local public agencies, 501 (c) (3) nonprofit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications (Program Agreements) for programs addressing the above elements. Questions about the application procedure can be directed to:
