A Practical Approach to Food Safety

A Mandarin Chinese-language Certification Course for Foodservice Managers

The National Restaurant Association (NRA) reports that an outbreak of foodborne illness can cost a restaurant more than \$75,000. Cases involving death and serious injury can cost much more. By serving safe food, you can avoid: legal fees, medical claims, employee lost wages, loss of food supplies that must be discarded, bad publicity, loss of business and income, and being shut down.

Certification Course

To prevent this from happening to your restaurant, attend the ServSafe™ certification course, an 18-hour course developed by the Educational Foundation of the National Restaurant Association. This course has been approved by the State of North Carolina for a possible two-points credit on your quarterly restaurant inspection. The entire course will be taught in Mandarin Chinese by a native Chinese speaker.

Who should attend?

The course is designed for foodservice managers and supervisory staff in restaurants, hospitals, nursing homes, child care facilities, and other food-handling establishments.

The cost is \$125.00. Fee includes one coursebook (in Chinese), one certification examination (in Chinese), and one certificate issued by the NRA. Space is limited, so register no later than February 10, 2006.

Certification

Certification will be provided by the Educational Foundation of the National Restaurant Association and will be based on attending all sessions and by passing the written examination with a 75% or higher. A certificate that can be displayed in your restaurant will be issued by the NRA to those who pass the examination.
