



## Roundup Your Electronics!

### New Statewide Ban on Disposal of Computer Equipment and TVs Goes Into Effect July 1, 2011

#### Materials Accepted at Drop-off Sites:

- Computers -- laptops, desktops and mainframes;
  - Televisions of all types – flat screens, projection tv's, consoles and portables;
  - Monitors, viewers and displays;
  - Keyboards, mice, printers, scanners, external drives and all computer peripherals;
  - Consumer electronics, including stereo equipment, CD and DVD players;
  - Electronic games and toys;
  - Cell phones;
  - Telephone equipment and fax machines;
  - Communications and networking equipment;
  - Digital cameras;
  - Rechargeable batteries (please leave batteries in equipment brought for disposal);
  - Connectors, cables and wiring;
  - Small household appliances, including microwaves, toaster ovens – virtually anything with a plug.
- (\*large appliances/white goods are accepted at the Guilford County Scrap Tire & White Goods Recycling Center)**

#### Materials Not Accepted at Drop-off Sites:

- Fluorescent lamps and tubes and fixtures;
- Alkaline batteries;
- Furniture;
- Sinks, tubs and other kitchen/bathroom fixtures;
- Explosives and ammunition;
- Garbage and medical waste; Paint;
- Household Hazardous Waste.
